On Wednesday evening, July 9, 2008 two of our Central Trunk Project team members attended the Southgate Meadows Neighborhood Association Meeting at the Elder Creek Marketplace. The meeting had eight public attendees. The agenda for the evening included a presentation from the County on the *Southeast Sacramento Bike and Pedestrian Access Study* – as well as our presentation. The access study is in very early stages of planning, so construction will not overlap with the Central Trunk Construction, however we shared the materials for Central Trunk with them for their reference.

Amber Parmer (Project Engineer) gave a ten minute presentation on the project utilizing display boards and samples of Central Trunk piping. Following the presentation, Amber addressed questions from the audience.

*During the question and answer session, HDR|The Hoyt Company recorded all comments and questions. See below:*

- Have you scheduled a meeting with AGENA?
- Is it due to age and use that the sewer pipeline is deteriorating?
- Any chance of the bypass lines backing up?
- Who dispensed the corrosive substance and is there any way to get remittance for that?
- Are there animals in the existing pipeline? Alligators?
- Will there be night work?
- Will there be noise wherever the project is?
- What type of traffic interruption do you anticipate?
- The Elder Creek intersection is very busy with FedEx, etc... when you do the bypass digging will it be done in the middle of the night, so that it doesn't disrupt traffic?

- Is this coming out of tax payer pockets? Where did the funding come from?
- We heard about this, at the Power Inn Alliance and thought before we received materials that the roads would need to be dug up.
- Are you concerned about safety of children and pedestrians? Fencing might be appropriate.
- Make sure the schools have the same principals, they change a lot.
- Will you contact the schools? Camelia School has a great PTA.
