



Minimum Geotechnical Program Requirements

Updated October 2, 2013

Because of the variety of projects SASD administers and reviews, it is not reasonable to have one set of minimum geotechnical program requirements. SASD expects a geotechnical program to include the following:

- reviews, studies, investigations, tests, analyses, and reports necessary to adequately describe the geotechnical conditions for the project
- geotechnical information necessary for the design of the project
- geotechnical conditions that present risks to the project costs and project timeline
- recommended mitigation measures for these risks

In the project submittal, include a report that covers all these items for:

- SASD reimbursed trunk projects,
- all pump station projects, and
- where otherwise requested by SASD or the project engineer.

Geotechnical reports for the overall project are acceptable as long as they cover these SASD Geotechnical Program Requirements. Reports that were signed more than 5 years ago need a signed and stamped memo from a geotechnical engineer stating either:

- the report is still valid or
- that provides minor updates to the report

Major updates to the geotechnical report shall be submitted to SASD for review as part of the project submittal.
